Cucamonga Crosswalls Project Update

Cucamonga Crosswalls – On July 16, 2018, GRB equipment began removing approximately 200,000 cubic yards of material from the crosswalls and stockpiling the material south of the dam. This phase of this project should be completed by November 16, 2018. The next phase of processing and hauling the material off-site may take up to 5 years.

As a courtesy, The Water Company tries to notify customers of possible leaks on their property after the meters are read. Most of our meters have the technology to *report* when water has continuously run thru the meter for 24 hours straight. We will send out automated phones calls to shareholders when this happens. Recently we have been receiving fewer call backs from these messages and have many repeat customers with no change in water usage. This makes us think that our messages are not listened to or hung up on immediately thinking we are a 'solicitor' call. Locating and stopping these leaks will save us water and save you money as well.
